After-School REACH Program Instructor

St. Peter's School is an independent, coeducational, non-sectarian Preschool through Eighth Grade school, educating approximately 155 students in the center of Philadelphia for over 180 years. St. Peter's School seeks part-time After-School REACH Program Instructors.

REACH Instructors are an extension of St. Peter's School teachers and have the same expectations as everyone in our community. The role is supervisory and involves planning programs, organizing activities for indoor and outdoor play for students of all ages. The engagement with the students includes, but is not limited to, homework assistance, imaginative play, gross motor development, theme based experiences and STEM/technology when appropriate. Instructors should be prepared to engage with the students, refrain from social media and usage of phones and model appropriate behavior to all in the community. This position is part time throughout the academic year, (September through mid-June.) Hours are Monday - Friday, 2:30-5:30 PM, with opportunities for full day work during days off of school or vacations/breaks in the school calendar

Instructors should be self-motivated, energetic, reliable, and responsible with previous experience working with children, preferably in an educational setting. They should be engaging, adaptable, professional with staff and parents, and have a clear passion for honing their educational skills. Orientation and onboarding will take place during the last week of August or early September. Clearances and some training is included and will be outlined prior to the start of the school year.

Additionally, the Instructor should be knowledgeable of student needs and age appropriate interactions. They should be a team player with excellent written and verbal communication skills and an interest in seeing students and adults working collaboratively. The ability to work with all adults and children of different ages respectfully and consistently is important. REACH Instructors report directly to the REACH Coordinator, who in turn reports to the Education Program Coordinator.

Expressing a positive attitude, interest in personal development, ability to work collaboratively on a team, and ability to receive and implement feedback as well as maintaining flexibility and demonstrating a willingness to adapt throughout the year is important, as well as demonstrating a commitment to and actively supporting the School, **its Mission, and the Diversity Mission Statement:**
